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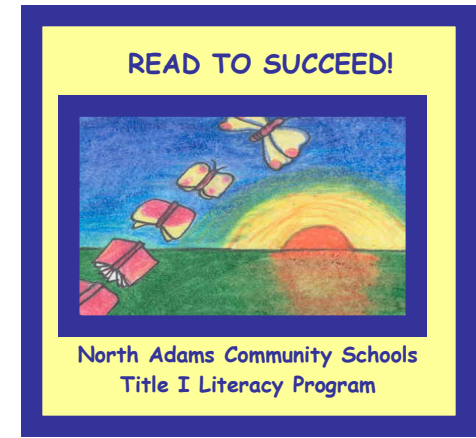

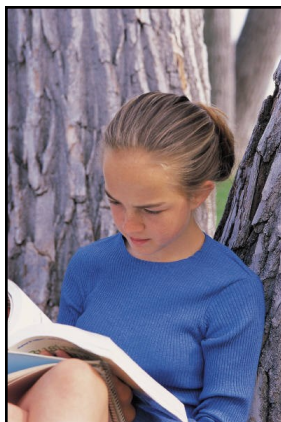

## North Adams Title I Program

The North Adams School District offers Title I programs at all qualifying public and private elementary schools for younger students who need additional help in learning to read. The Curriculum used is *Leveled Literacy Intervention*, and *Reading A-Z*. Title I programs are funded through a state Title I grant and comply with all federal and state Title I requirements.



Classroom and Title I teachers work together to select students who would most benefit from the extra instruction. Following a parent meeting and completion of a Parent-Student-Teacher Compact, students are enrolled in the Title I program for the year in most cases.

The Title I teacher provides individual or small group instruction during the school day. This time is in addition to the student's regular classroom 90 minute reading instruction. Title I focuses on re-teaching and reinforcing reading skills including phonemic awareness, phonics, word knowledge, sight vocabulary, fluency, & reading comprehension.



### Kindergarten Literacy...

Kindergarten students who need additional experiences participate in the Title I small



groups program. Students are immersed in reading and writing activities that provide additional language development and practice in learning to read.



**Title I Tutoring...** Highly Qualified teachers and teacher assistants provide during and/or afterschool tutoring for students who need additional instruction and practice in reading skills. Teachers meet with students in small groups and design a program that addresses each child's individual reading needs. Teachers use scientifically research-based curriculum, resources, and instructional strategies in tutoring to keep the learning interesting and challenging. The Title I teacher talks regularly with the student's classroom teacher to check progress. Title I tutoring may be scheduled from 2 to 5 times per week depending upon the program availability and the student's learning needs.
